Culture shock

During cross-cultural contact, people see themselves in a much broader context. This can lead to an anxiety-provoking change in perceptions of self and identity, particularly where the identity was previously constructed largely from local social interaction.



A significant change in culture asks students to develop strategies to cope with the inevitable stress as well as learning new social skills. When overseas students encounter the new culture of the University they can be uncertain about the home people's attitudes, values and behaviours. (Gudykunst, 1998)
