CIE Curriculum Innovation Fund

The Centre for Innovation in Education will make available annually funding to support innovative teaching practice across the University of Liverpool and to provide assistance to programme/module teams who wish to research and demonstrate innovative module or programme teaching practice (including the use of technology) in the enhancement of the University of Liverpool student experience.

1. The award(s) shall be known as the CIE Curriculum Innovation Fund.
2. The total value of any awards disbursed in a single academic year shall be based on the allocated budget of £10,000 and will not exceed £3,000.00 per application.
3. Applications will be made available on an annual basis and applications are open to University of Liverpool staff and students only.
4. The award(s) shall be used by the Centre for Innovation in Education to fund the development and research of innovative module or programme development and teaching practice.
5. All successful applications must include paid student participation as active partners in the project(s).
6. The disbursement of the award(s) will be approved by the Leadership Team of the Centre for Innovation in Education, with one Faculty representative and one representative of the Guild of Students.
7. If in any year there shall be no application of sufficient merit, the award for that year shall be withheld, CIE may from time to time determine to allocate the funds to a single project relating to innovation in the curriculum to be agreed in line with item 6.
8. CIE and Student Experience and Enhancement (SEE) shall have power to amend the foregoing regulations associated with the award(s), and that the budgeted fund shall always be used to support innovative teaching practice at the University.

Successful applicants will be expected to provide the following outcomes and deliverables on completion of their awarded project, but not limited to;

1. Present their project and findings at the annual Learning & Teaching Conference.
2. Produce a case study aligning the project to one of the 3 hallmarks and 3 attributes of the Curriculum 2021 framework.
3. Demonstrate student involvement in the project and impact on the student experience.
