

Taster Studentships

- There has been a request from later years students in being involved in a research project but feel it is now 'too late', to access existing research opportunities.
- Time poor with respect to rotations and further EMS.
- Or are not sure if it is for them
- 1-3 weeks
- Match funding from vet school
- In addition to our program of longer funded vacation studentships - 6-10 week (WT, Vet School, charities)



Public Engagement

- Public engagement is an important part of research
- The UoL has a collaboration with Liverpool Museum to host 'Meet the Scientist' events.
- These comprise a variety of stations with different scientific, medical and veterinary themes.


