Staff Report: Claudette Graham Interchange Co-ordinator

At the start of 2017 our 24 new students and all our VCOs including our first time VCOs, had settled into their research and work based learning projects and set about collecting the data.

I visited and arranged meetings with a number of VCOs to deliver briefing sessions for new projects for the 2017-18 intake which resulted in producing the project booklet which included 45 project proposals from 24 VCOs including 10 new VCOs to include UTS Foundation, St Andrews Bebington, The Big Help Project and Sheila Kay Trust.

Along with the Interchange Secretary we spoke to a number of potential new trustees and invited them to observe committee meetings before agreeing at the AGM to welcome two new trustees to the board.

As we said goodbye to our 24 students at their graduation ceremony in July we welcomed 25 students in September that started a partnership with their VCO to include Health Watch Wirral, Sahir House, LCVS and WOW (Writing on the Wall).

Negotiations had been ongoing to expand the staff in Interchange and after a series of interviews we welcomed our new Interchange Student Experience Team Administrator, Alishia Fitzsimmons.

We were successful in obtaining funding for the Festival of Social Science and held a seminar during the weeklong event in November where a delegation attended from the Netherlands.

I worked with the SET Administrator and the Academic Supervisors in developing a presentation on the introduction of the new Interchange Module scoi311 (Bespoke Policy Review). The module will begin in September 2019 and will be a 15credit module in Semester 1.

Working with the Interchange Treasurer we adapted the Interchange accounts to reflect the in-kind support the charity receives from the University of Liverpool.

I continue to support the Interchange Trustees in particular with the planning of events and updating our accounts. I also continue to provide an outreach service to our VCOs and a drop in or 1:1 service for our soci303 students and any potential students enquiring about doing the Interchange Portfolio in their 3rd year.

As we approached the end of 2017 our 25 students had all submitted their Ethics project strategy and settled in with their research/work based learning projects and Link Workers.

Alishia Fitzsimmons – Interchange Student Experience Officer

I entered my post August 2017 just in time to welcome 25 new students in September. I attended a majority of the workshops and spent time getting to know our students and VCOs.

I spent time preparing for and organising our Festival of Social Science event, which was a great success. And also began preparations and materials for the introduction of our new module Soci311 and for an event in the New Year to introduce it to the organisations that we work with.

I continued to provide support and one on one sessions for our students and VCOs, helping both to settle in to a working relationship and attending a number of the learning agreement meetings. At the end of year all of the students had submitted Ethics strategies and begun planning for data collection in 2018.

We also saw some amazing student projects and excellent students who graduated in July 2017. Out of this cohort (listed below) we have been fortunate to have Thomas Hilbig join us as a trustee. We welcome the perspective of our students and especially the skills and insights Thomas brings to the charity. We also welcomed Gemma Simpson-Tasker and Emeka Onuora as new Trustees.

Secretary's Report: Lindsey Metcalf

As a very small charity, Interchange relies on its volunteers to provide support to Claudette and Alishia (our paid staff). Management Committee members represent the organisation externally and help to plan our special events as well as their main role of ensuring effective governance of the charity. The committee has been active in moving forward with Interchange's strategic goals and undertook work to develop its ethos statement, plan public events and consult on a new, shorter project format.

In 2017 we welcomed Gemma Simpson-Tasker, Thomas Hilbig and Emy Onuora to the committee. Thomas is a former Interchange student, having completed a project with the Anthony Walker Foundation. Gemma and Emy bring their local voluntary sector knowledge – Emy is connected to the Sheila Kay Fund, while Gemma works for Career Connect and has previously hosted an Interchange student.

In November 2017 Interchange ran its 4th Festival of Social Science event at Blackburne House. This was thanks to a successful bid to the Economic and Social Research Council. The event was focused on "Working together in times of austerity" and brought together local voluntary organisations, academics and students. We also welcomed a group of Dutch academics who were on a visit to the UK. Our keynote speaker was Professor David Whyte who spoke about some of the themes from his recently published book (co-edited with Dr Vicky Cooper) entitled "The Violence of Austerity". Dr Lindsey Metcalf shared her research into the experiences of volunteer trustees who are leading Merseyside charities though the challenging external environment. Finally, Thomas Hilbig reported on his experience of completing an Interchange project for his degree. He worked with Anthony Walker Foundation on a review of Merseyside's hate crime strategy and had also presented his findings to the Deputy Police Commissioner and a wide range of public and voluntary agencies during Hate Crime Awareness Week in October 2017.
