Questions for the patient

General and history	Glasses
Do you have a problem with your vision?	Do you need glasses?
Has your vision changed?	For near?
Do you have eye strain?	For distance?
Do you have any other eye problems from before? Glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy, AMD, cataract	For both?
	Are your glasses with you?
Reading	Are your glasses at home?
Can you read as you did before your stroke?	Are your glasses broken?
If you can't read, is this because of your vision?	Have you had your glasses tested within the last year, two years?
Central vision	Perception
Do you have blurred, reduced or altered vision?	Do you struggle to recognise objects, faces?
	Do you struggle with clutter?
Do you have glare?	Can you see colours ok?
Are you now sensitive to light?	Do you see more than two images of objects?
Peripheral vision	Do you see images that are not actually there?
Are you missing vision to one side or anywhere in your sight?	Animal, people, flower images or otherwise?
, , ,	Do you have flashing lights in your vision?
Eye movements	Do objects move when they should be still?
Do you have double or jumbled vision?	Do objects move in jumps rather than steadily?
Do things wobble?	Do you have problems judging distances or depth?
	Do you get lost or forget where you are?





Questions for carers/family

General concerns

Do you have concerns about their vision?

Do they have problems with reading? Are they misjudging things or distances?

Do you think they are seeing things they shouldn't - visual hallucinations?

Do they have problems recognising family or friends?

Do they have difficulty in naming objects?

Observations about mobility

Do they miss things to one side?

Do they bump into things?

Do they get lost in familiar environments?

Observations about personal care

Do you notice problems with their personal care?

Not shaving, combing hair, brushing teeth, eating, to one side

Observations about their eyes

Are their eyes constantly moving or jerking?

Has one of their eyes moved from being straight – a squint? If so, which eye?

Has it moved up, down, left, right?

Are they turning their head when trying to look at things?

Has it moved up, down, left, right?

Are they closing one eye when looking at things?

Have you noticed one or both of their eyelids droop?
