| What you could do | Practical examples |

| Follow a structure | Follow the structure of a course book from the Language Lounge, or ask a Language Adviser to guide you. |
| Master one point before moving on to the next | If something is not clear, consult a grammar reference book from the Language Lounge or ask our Language Advisers for help. |
| Learn from your mistakes | When work is returned to you, make a written note of recurring mistakes and comments. Re-write your work correctly. |
| Repeat and revise | Keep practising the same grammar point using a range of books and online sources until you have mastered it. |
| Notice grammar in context | Take note of the grammatical aspects of real texts, including songs, newspapers, and film dialogue. Copy the structures that you read and hear. |
| Practise using different grammatical styles | Try texts, films, and radio programmes that feature formal, colloquial, or regional language, and that cover a range of topics. Sign up for conversation exchange in the Language Lounge. |
