
Discover the Past: Monuments



Fact File: Monuments

Monuments are structures that are built in different places to help people to remember important events or significant people. They are often built in public places, so lots of people can see them.

This is a monument built in 1913 to remember Florence Nightingale. It is in Liverpool. You can find it on the Sisters of Mersey app.



Florence lived between 1820 and 1910. She became a nurse, even though her family did not want her to at first. During the Crimean War (1853-1856) she helped wounded soldiers and trained other nurses. Florence became known as 'The Lady with the Lamp'.

Florence raised money to train more nurses. In 1865, the first Nightingale Nurses started work at the Liverpool Workhouse Infirmary.
