

VACCINATION

Vaccination is a key part of population health. The World Small Animal Veterinary Association vaccine guidelines include a call to vaccinate more animals.



STUDY

Data collected from 101 UK vet practices taking part in SAVSNET over two years.

VACCINE RECORDS

Compared with dogs, cats and rabbits were 1.4 and 2.8 times more likely to have no recorded vaccine respectively.

PRIMARY COURSES

Recorded kitten and puppy vaccines peaked at 12 weeks of age; few animals received early (<9 weeks) or later (16 weeks) vaccines.

INSURANCE

Uninsured animals were less likely to be vaccinated than insured animals.
