

Changes to GP Placements

• Pairs of Students

- New Year 5 placement
- Year 2 Pilot
- Remuneration







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- Induction
 - o Welcome, meet staff
 - o Orientation in practice and local area
 - o Safety
 - \circ Expectations of the student/placement





- Individual Educational supervision
 - \circ Regular meetings to discuss students aims and progress
 - o CPADs, OEs, DOPs
 - \circ Individual meetings with students





- Observing surgeries
 - o GP

 \circ Other healthcare professionals

- Consulting Independently
 - \circ Indirectly observed consultations
 - o Presentation of cases to GP Tutor
 - Minimum 12 per week (telephone/video/f2f)







• Mandatory Experiences

• Commonplace events in primary care

- o Excellent learning events for students
- o Debrief with GP to "cement" learning







Changes to GP Placements

- Pairs of Students
- New Year 5 placement
- Year 2 Pilot
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Pairs of Students

- We realise that this may feel challenging
 - \circ To achieve placements through Y2-5 we needed to make this change
- Observing Surgeries
 - Student Doctors can be split-up to sit in with different practitioners
 - o As long as both students have similar experience over the 4 weeks
 - Same number of GP surgeries/Practice Nurse Clinics etc
- Independent Consultations
 - Can see patients **as a pair**, with 1 student leading consultation, the other giving feedback
 - 0 Aim for 12 consultations per week **per pair**

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Pairs of Students

• Mandatory Experiences

 \circ In pairs or individually as suits the practice and the nature of the experience

• Individual Educational Supervision

 Essential that this remains Individual Meetings with each student to review progress







New Year 5 Placement

- All Y5 Students placed in GP • Previously only a select number via SAMP
- Part of Y5 "Acute Block"
 - **3 weeks** each in GP, A&E, Crit Care, Acute Med, Acute Surg, Acute Psych
- Similar format to Y3/4 GP placements
 - o Observe GP Surgeries and other Healthcare Professionals
 - Mandatory Experiences (3)
 - Educational Supervision





New Year 5 Placement

- Mandatory Experiences
 - o Write a referral/admission letter
 - Review a Discharge letter and conduct a medication review
 - o Manage GP prescription queries and repeat prescriptions

• Aims

- To understand Acute Care in GP and the Primary-Secondary Care "interface"
- o Explore reasons for management decisions taken in Primary Care





Year 2 Pilot

• Ran 2 years ago • Paused during COVID in 2020/21

• Aligns with Year 3 Timetable

• Y2 students on placement when Y3 are not (Academic Weeks)

- 1 week placement
 - o Observing GP surgeries and other Healthcare Professionals
 - \circ Chances to take histories

• Likely to change format next Academic Year (Sept 2022)

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Remuneration

• Increase from £60 per student per session to £70 per student per session

• Same funding rate across all placements

- Induction
 - o COVID
 - ≻ PPE
 - Distancing within practice
 - > What to do if symptoms/contact with COVID
 - ➢ Pastoral Care







• Home Visits

• Paused last year, but **encouraged** now

- Home Visits Guidance in Handbooks
 - o Risk Assessment
 - Lateral Flow Testing
 - > Vaccination Status (Patient/Student)
 - ➢ Level of risk to patient
 - \succ Reason for Visit
 - Student Doctor's level of concern/personal health risk
 - o Consent
 - o Travel to/from visit
 - \circ Minimise risk while on the visit



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- Different consultation types
 - Involve students
 - Let them try phone and video consulting Involve in triage
- ePortfolio requirements
 - OPADs back to pre COVID requirements
 OEs back to pre COVID requirements







- Mandatory Experiences
 - 0 Y3/4

> Only 2 out of the 4 required this year

• Y5

≻ All 3 required

• Plan to increase requirements back to normal in future • We will keep you informed
