Keynote Address:

'Learning in an Uncertain World' - Dr Russell Peek, Director of Medical Education, Gloucestershire Hospitals

We are delighted to announce that Dr Russell Peek, Consultant Paediatrician at Gloucester Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust will be opening our conference with his keynote speech.

Clinicians encounter uncertainty every day, and yet preparing learners for uncertainty in practice has not always been explicit in curricula. In this session we will consider the causes, nature, and impact of medical uncertainty, and how we might better prepare learners for situations where we do not or cannot 'know'.

Student in Difficulty – Dr Debbie Finn

Provided annually (and strongly recommended for new tutors), this workshop will cover:

- Using both example scenarios and delegates own experiences, discuss how to address these difficulties practically.
- Learn how (and when) to raise concerns to the school and learn about the University's procedures and processes.
- Learn more about the support systems in place for Student Doctor's within the School of Medicine.

Course updates (including the new Y5 block placement) – Dr Dave Longford

This workshop outlines the key changes to this year's GP placements with including the new Year 5 block placements. This workshop may be of particular interest to new tutors and Year 5 Tutors.

Q&A drop in – Dr Matt James

An opportunity for Tutors to pose their questions to Dr Matt James, our SupraTheme Lead for Patient in the Community Setting. This workshop replaces the end of conference Q&A from previous years.

Active Bystander Training – The Active Bystander Training Company

This Active Bystander training session aims to empower our GP Tutors to challenge poor behaviours which have become normalised and bring about change through the reinforcement of messages defining the boundaries of unacceptable behaviour. We hope that by working together we can create a safe and supportive working environment for our students while on clinical placements.

Transformational Learning - Dr David Lewis

Discover why getting it wrong is, sometimes, the best thing you could do. We may learn best when things are difficult, or surprising, or a bit weird! We will look at threshold concepts (difficult but key ideas, without which a learner can't progress) and troublesome knowledge (new, alien or counter-intuitive ideas that might feel uncomfortable to start with), and why the easy stuff may be boring and pointless.

Evaluation at Liverpool School of Medicine. Dr Anna Ballinger

This workshop will provide an overview of the school's student evaluation processes and wider evaluation processes such as the National Students survey. What do we use the evaluation for? How do we feed this back to our students and staff? It will also explore Quality Assurance and our statutory body requirements.

Practical Tips for Remote Consulting with Students – Dr Anna Stickland

This workshop will consider the educational benefits and challenges of engaging student doctors in remote consultations. We will discuss opportunities for student involvement in remote consultations and how to help students to make the most of these whilst in General Practice. We will discuss practical advice related to engaging students in remote consultations; with the opportunity to share tips with colleagues.
