

SCHOLARSHIP AND BURSARY REGULATIONS  
ACADEMIC YEAR 2013/14

**1) Scope of the Regulations**

- 1.1) These Regulations apply to students first entering undergraduate and taught master's postgraduate programmes at the University of Liverpool and the University of Liverpool in London in academic year 2013/14, and students entering research postgraduate programmes during the period October 2013 until September 2014 inclusive. Unless otherwise stated, they will continue to apply to such students for the duration of their programme of study, subject to Section 1.3 below.
- 1.2) Scholarships and bursaries under these Regulations are not available to the following groups of students:
- a) Students who have transferred from another undergraduate programme at the University of Liverpool will be considered under the Regulations applicable in the academic year in which they started their study. The 2013/14 Regulations are therefore not applicable to such students.
  - b) 'Home' and 'EU' students who have previously achieved a qualification at an equivalent or higher level, whether in the UK or elsewhere. However, students studying on programmes which may be exempted from the government withdrawal of funding for students studying equivalent and lower level qualifications (ELQ), and where the University has chosen to apply this exemption, may be considered for scholarships and bursaries under these Regulations. Similarly, where a student is exempt from the ELQ policy as a result of holding a Disabled Student's Allowance, they may also be considered for scholarships and bursaries.
  - c) 'Home' and 'EU' students in years 1-3 of undergraduate programmes in the School of Health Sciences, where tuition fees are paid in full by the NHS.
  - d) Students in years 2-4 of graduate entry programmes in Medicine and Dental Surgery, where funding is available via the NHS Bursary Scheme.
  - e) Students in year 5 of conventional entry programmes in Medicine and Dental Surgery.
  - f) Students entering the Medicine and Surgery programme (A105) at Lancaster University, for whom a different bursary scheme is in operation.
  - g) Students on the MSc Nuclear Science and Technology programme, run under the auspices of the Nuclear Education Training Consortium.
  - h) Students in all years of the Diploma in Dental Hygiene/Therapy.
  - i) Students on University of Liverpool programmes taught at an associated college, where the tuition fee is payable directly to that college; for example years 0 and 1 taught at Wirral Metropolitan College as part of a 2+2 programme. For such students, the associated college is responsible for scholarship and bursary arrangements.
  - j) Students registered with the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine.
  - k) Students transferring to the University of Liverpool from Xi'an Jiaotong-Liverpool University.
  - l) Students transferring to the University of Liverpool from partnership institutions where an alternative fee payment or scholarship arrangement has been made<sup>1</sup>.
  - m) 'Home' and 'EU' students for whom fees are charged under the pre-2012 and pre-2006 fee regulations.

n) Students in receipt of staff fee remission.

- 1.3) Unless otherwise stated, scholarships and bursaries under these Regulations are available to full-time students on University of Liverpool award bearing programmes and, where other requirements are satisfied and unless otherwise stated, on a pro-rata basis to those full-time students repeating a year of study on a University of Liverpool award bearing programme with partial attendance<sup>2</sup>. Where a student repeats a year of study with full or partial attendance so that their total period of registration is greater than the normal length of their programme, scholarships and bursaries will only be available for a maximum number of years equal to the maximum period of public funding. This is usually the normal length of the programme plus one academic year.
- 1.4) Where the scholarships and bursaries described in these Regulations are to be paid directly into the student's bank account, students will be unable to receive these scholarships and bursaries unless they hold a sterling current account with a UK clearing bank and have notified the Student Loan Company (SLC) and/or the University of the account details.
- 1.5) Where scholarships or bursaries are dependent on household income, the scholarship or bursary can only be paid where the student's Local Authority, Student Finance England (SFE), the Student Awards Agency for Scotland (SAAS), Student Finance Wales (SFW), Student Finance Northern Ireland (SFNI), or the SLC has been provided with information on household income and consent has been given for that information to be shared with the University.
- 1.6) These Regulations shall apply to the following scholarships and bursaries:
- a) The Liverpool Bursary
  - b) The Care Leavers' Opportunity Bursary
  - c) The Liverpool Scholars Award
  - d) The Realising Opportunities Award
  - e) The North Liverpool Academy Scholarship
  - f) The Enterprise South Liverpool Academy Scholarship
  - g) The Parklands High Bursary
  - h) The Eliahou Dangoor Scholarship
  - i) The Postgraduate Loyalty Award
  - j) The Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship
  - k) The International Baccalaureate Award
  - l) The Liverpool Affinity Award
  - m) The India Postgraduate Taught Award
  - n) The Nigeria Postgraduate Taught Award
  - o) The Liverpool International College Postgraduate Taught Award
  - p) The Liverpool International College Merit Award
  - q) The Liverpool College Merit Award

The University and individual academic departments also provide a range of other scholarships and awards. Full details of these are published elsewhere.

- 1.7) Students may not be awarded more than one of the bursaries, awards or scholarships listed in Section 1.6, a) through to g).
- 1.8) With the exception of those tasks specifically identified in these Regulations as the responsibility of other offices, the administration of these scholarships and bursaries will be undertaken by the University's Student Administration and Support (SAS) Division. Applicants for programmes should

Registered students may enquire about scholarships and bursaries in person at the Student Administration Centre, ground floor, Foundation Building, by post to Student Administration, University of Liverpool, Foundation Building, Brownlow Hill, Liverpool, L69 7ZX, or by e-mail to [feeseng@liv.ac.uk](mailto:feeseng@liv.ac.uk).

## **2) The Liverpool Bursary**

- 2.1) The Liverpool Bursary will be paid to 'home' (UK) undergraduate students and to EU undergraduate students classified by the SLC as 'home'<sup>3</sup> who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1) and whose household income in the relevant academic year, as assessed by their Local Authority, SFE, SAAS, SFW, SFNI, or the SLC, is less than or equal to the qualifying threshold.
- 2.2) For academic year 2013/14, the qualifying threshold for the Liverpool Bursary will be £35,000. This figure may rise in line with inflation in subsequent years.
- 2.3) For students resident in England whose household income is less than or equal to £25,000, the Liverpool Bursary will be of value £3,000 in the first year of study, made available as a National Scholarship, and £2,000 in subsequent years of study, where household income remains equal to or less than £25,000 in each subsequent year.
- 2.4) For students resident outside England whose household income is less than or equal to £25,000, the Liverpool Bursary will be of value £2,000 in the first year of study and £2,000 in subsequent years of study, where household income remains equal to or less than £25,000 in each subsequent year.
- 2.5) For students resident in England whose household income is less than or equal to £25,000, the Liverpool Bursary will be available in the first year of study as a tuition fee waiver of £3,000, or as an accommodation fee waiver of £3,000, or as a tuition fee waiver of £2,000 and a cash bursary of £1,000, or as an accommodation fee waiver of £2,000 and a cash bursary of £1,000. For students resident outside England whose household income is less than or equal to £25,000, the Liverpool Bursary will be available in the first year of study as a tuition fee waiver of £2,000, or as an accommodation fee waiver of £2,000, or as a tuition fee waiver of £1,000 and a cash bursary of £1,000, or as an accommodation fee waiver of £1,000 and a cash bursary of £1,000. In subsequent years, the Liverpool Bursary will be available to students resident in and outside England as a tuition fee waiver of £2,000, or as an accommodation fee waiver of £2,000, or as a cash bursary of £2,000.
- 2.6) For students whose household income is between £25,001 and £35,000, the Liverpool Bursary will be of value £1,000 in each year of study where household income remains between £25,001 and £35,000. The Liverpool Bursary will be available as a tuition fee waiver of £1,000, or as an accommodation fee waiver of £1,000, or as a cash bursary of £1,000.
- 2.7) For the purposes of sections 2.5 and 2.6, "accommodation" refers to that owned and managed by the University of Liverpool.
- 2.8) In accordance with sections 2.5 and 2.6, all 'home' (UK) undergraduate students will be invited to select their choice of fee waiver, bursary or combination of both as part of the online registration process undertaken from 2 September 2013. Changes to preference following submission of

registration must be made in writing to feesenq@liverpool.ac.uk and will not be accepted after 4 October 2013. Preference for subsequent years of study will be invited upon registration for each academic year.

- 2.9) Students will be invited to select their preference before an assessment of their eligibility for the Liverpool Bursary is undertaken. An invitation to select the preferred Liverpool Bursary option during the registration process does not constitute eligibility for the Liverpool Bursary. Successful recipients of the Liverpool Bursary will be informed in writing in October 2013.
- 2.10) Where the cash bursary option is chosen for academic year 2013/14, payments (in accordance with Sections 2.3, 2.4, 2.5 and 2.6) will only be made following positive confirmation of attendance on each of the dates specified in Section 19. In line with UK government policy regarding tuition fee loan liability, cash bursary payments will be made in the proportions and on the dates specified in Section 19. All payments will be made directly into the student's bank account through the SLC Higher Education Bursary and Scholarships Scheme (HEBSS).
- 2.11) Where a student undertakes a compulsory year abroad or in industry as a part of their programme of study and as a result is charged tuition fees at a reduced rate, the Liverpool Bursary will be paid at a rate of 50% of the full amount for which the student would otherwise qualify during the year abroad or in industry, available as a fee waiver or a cash bursary. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the Liverpool Bursary during that period.

### **3) The Care Leavers' Opportunity Bursary**

- 3.1) The Care Leavers' Opportunity Bursary will be available to 'home' (UK) undergraduate students and to EU undergraduate students classified by the SLC as 'home' who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), and who have spent a minimum of 6 months in Local Authority care within the 10 years prior to making an application through UCAS, and who are under 28 years of age on 1 September 2013.
- 3.2) The Care Leavers' Opportunity Bursary will be of value £3,000, available as a fee waiver of £3,000 or as a cash bursary of £3,000, and will continue to be paid for the normal duration of a student's study on their programme.
- 3.3) Possible recipients with confirmed (UF) offers will be identified by the University's Student Recruitment and Admissions Office (SRAO) in August 2013 and contacted with further details and a request to provide evidence of care leaver status in one of the following forms:
  - i) Signed letter from leaving care team;
  - ii) Signed letter from designated teacher;
  - iii) Signed letter from social worker;
  - iv) Completed University pro forma, signed by any one of the persons identified in i), ii), or iii).
- 3.4) All students identified as possible recipients of the Care Leavers' Opportunity Bursary will be required to complete a pro forma within which they must indicate their preferred Bursary receipt option (as identified in Section 3.2). Where the cash bursary option is chosen for academic year 2013/14, payments will only be made following positive confirmation of attendance on each of the dates specified in Section 19. In line with UK government policy regarding tuition fee loan liability, cash bursary payments will be made in the proportions and on the dates specified in Section 19. All payments will be made directly into the student's bank account through the SLC Higher Education Bursary and Scholarships Scheme (HEBSS).

- 3.5) Where a student undertakes a compulsory year abroad or in industry as a part of their programme of study and as a result is charged tuition fees at a reduced rate, the Care Leavers' Opportunity Bursary will be paid at a rate of 50% of the full Bursary (i.e. £1,500) during the year abroad or in industry. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the Care Leavers' Opportunity Bursary during that period.
- 3.6) Previous recipients of the Care Leavers' Opportunity Bursary who return to the University of Liverpool to complete an MArch programme will continue to receive the full Bursary. Students entering Year 4 of the MArch programme who did not complete their BA Architecture programme at the University will not be eligible to receive the Care Leavers' Opportunity Bursary.

#### **4) The Liverpool Scholars Award**

- 4.1) The Liverpool Scholars Award will be available to 'home' (UK) undergraduate students, or 'EU' undergraduate students classified by the SLC as 'home', who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1) and who enter the University in academic year 2013/14 as part of the University of Liverpool Scholars Scheme.
- 4.2) Prior to the start of the 2013/14 academic year, the University's SRAO will determine those applicants with confirmed (UF) offers who are to receive a Liverpool Scholars Award and will provide a definitive list to the University's SAS Division.
- 4.3) Decisions on eligibility for the Liverpool Scholars Award will be made on admission, are not subject to appeal, and students not in receipt of the award during their entry year will not be able to receive the award in subsequent years.
- 4.4) The Liverpool Scholars Award will be of value £3,000, available as a fee waiver of £3,000 or as a cash bursary of £3,000, and will continue to be paid for the normal duration of a student's study on their programme.
- 4.5) Successful recipients will be contacted and asked to indicate their preferred Award receipt option (as identified in Section 4.4). Where the cash bursary option is chosen for academic year 2013/14, payments will only be made following positive confirmation of attendance on each of the dates specified in Section 19. In line with UK government policy regarding tuition fee loan liability, cash bursary payments will be made in the proportions and on the dates specified in Section 19. All payments will be made directly into the student's bank account through the SLC Higher Education Bursary and Scholarships Scheme (HEBSS).
- 4.6) Where a student undertakes a compulsory year abroad or in industry as a part of their programme of study and as a result is charged tuition fees at a reduced rate, the Liverpool Scholars Award will be paid at a rate of 50% of the full Award (i.e. £1,500) during the year abroad or in industry. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the Liverpool Scholars Award during that period.

#### **5) The Realising Opportunities Award**

- 5.1) The Realising Opportunities Award will be available to 'home' (UK) undergraduate students, or 'EU' undergraduate students classified by the SLC as 'home', who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1) and who enter the University in academic year 2013/14 as part of the Realising Opportunities programme.

- 5.2) Prior to the start of the 2013/14 academic year, the University's SRAO will determine those applicants with confirmed (UF) offers who are to receive a Realising Opportunities Award and will provide a definitive list to the University's SAS Division.
- 5.3) Decisions on eligibility for the Realising Opportunities Award will be made on admission, are not subject to appeal, and students not in receipt of the award during their entry year will not be able to receive the award in subsequent years.
- 5.4) The Realising Opportunities Award will be of value £3,000, available as a fee waiver of £3,000 or as a cash bursary of £3,000, and will continue to be paid for the normal duration of a student's study on their programme.
- 5.5) Successful recipients will be contacted and asked to indicate their preferred Award receipt option (as identified in Section 5.4). Where the cash bursary option is chosen for academic year 2013/14, payments will only be made following positive confirmation of attendance on each of the dates specified in Section 19. In line with UK government policy regarding tuition fee loan liability, cash bursary payments will be made in the proportions and on the dates specified in Section 19. All payments will be made directly into the student's bank account through the SLC Higher Education Bursary and Scholarships Scheme (HEBSS).
- 5.6) Where a student undertakes a compulsory year abroad or in industry as a part of their programme of study and as a result is charged tuition fees at a reduced rate, the Realising Opportunities Award will be paid at a rate of 50% of the full Award (i.e. £1,500) during the year abroad or in industry. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the Realising Opportunities Award during that period.

## **6) The North Liverpool Academy Scholarship**

- 6.1) The North Liverpool Academy Scholarship will be available to 'home' (UK) undergraduate students, or 'EU' undergraduate students classified by the SLC as 'home', who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1) and who enter the University in academic year 2013/14 following study at the North Liverpool Academy, 120 Heyworth Street, Liverpool, L5 0SQ.
- 6.2) Prior to the start of the 2013/14 academic year, the University's SRAO will determine those applicants with confirmed (UF) offers who are to receive a North Liverpool Academy Scholarship and will provide a definitive list to the University's SAS Division.
- 6.3) Decisions on eligibility for the North Liverpool Academy Scholarship will be made on admission, are not subject to appeal, and students not in receipt of the award during their entry year will not be able to receive the award in subsequent years.
- 6.4) The North Liverpool Academy Scholarship will be of value £3,000, available as a fee waiver of £3,000 or as a cash bursary of £3,000, and will continue to be paid for the normal duration of a student's study on their programme.
- 6.5) Successful recipients will be contacted and asked to indicate their preferred Scholarship receipt option (as identified in Section 6.4). Where the cash bursary option is chosen for academic year 2013/14, payments will only be made following positive confirmation of attendance on each of the dates specified in Section 19. In line with UK government policy regarding tuition fee loan liability, cash bursary payments will be made in the proportions and on the dates specified in Section 19. All

payments will be made directly into the student's bank account through the SLC Higher Education Bursary and Scholarships Scheme (HEBSS).

- 6.6) Where a student undertakes a compulsory year abroad or in industry as a part of their programme of study and as a result is charged tuition fees at a reduced rate, the North Liverpool Academy Scholarship will be paid at a rate of 50% of the full Scholarship (i.e. £1,500) during the year abroad or in industry. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the North Liverpool Academy Scholarship during that period.

## **7) The Enterprise South Liverpool Academy Scholarship**

- 7.1) The Enterprise South Liverpool Academy Scholarship will be available to 'home' (UK) undergraduate students, or 'EU' undergraduate students classified by the SLC as 'home', who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1) and who enter the University in academic year 2013/14 following study at its Horrocks Avenue or Heath Road campuses.
- 7.2) Prior to the start of the 2013/14 academic year, the University's SRAO will determine those applicants with confirmed (UF) offers who are to receive an Enterprise South Liverpool Academy Scholarship and will provide a definitive list to the University's SAS Division.
- 7.3) Decisions on eligibility for the Enterprise South Liverpool Academy Scholarship will be made on admission, are not subject to appeal, and students not in receipt of the award during their entry year will not be able to receive the award in subsequent years.
- 7.4) The Enterprise South Liverpool Academy Scholarship will be of value £3,000, available as a fee waiver of £3,000 or as a cash bursary of £3,000, and will continue to be paid for the normal duration of a student's study on their programme.
- 7.5) Successful recipients will be contacted and asked to indicate their preferred Scholarship receipt option (as identified in Section 7.4). Where the cash bursary option is chosen for academic year 2013/14, payments will only be made following positive confirmation of attendance on each of the dates specified in Section 19. In line with UK government policy regarding tuition fee loan liability, cash bursary payments will be made in the proportions and on the dates specified in Section 19. All payments will be made directly into the student's bank account through the SLC Higher Education Bursary and Scholarships Scheme (HEBSS).
- 7.6) Where a student undertakes a compulsory year abroad or in industry as a part of their programme of study and as a result is charged tuition fees at a reduced rate, the Enterprise South Liverpool Academy Scholarship will be paid at a rate of 50% of the full Scholarship (i.e. £1,500) during the year abroad or in industry. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the Enterprise South Liverpool Academy Scholarship during that period.

## **8) The Parklands High Bursary**

- 8.1) The Parklands High Bursary will be available to 'home' (UK) undergraduate students, or 'EU' undergraduate students classified by the SLC as 'home', who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1) and who enter the University in academic year 2013/14 having taken their GCSE examinations at Parklands High School, Ganworth Road, Liverpool, L24 2RZ.

- 8.2) Prior to the start of the 2013/14 academic year, the University's SRAO will determine those applicants with confirmed (UF) offers who are to receive a Parklands High Bursary and will provide a definitive list to the University's SAS Division.
- 8.3) Decisions on eligibility for the Parklands High Bursary will be made on admission, are not subject to appeal, and students not in receipt of the award during their entry year will not be able to receive the award in subsequent years.
- 8.4) The Parklands High Bursary will be of value £3,000, available as a fee waiver of £3,000 or as a cash bursary of £3,000, and will continue to be paid for the normal duration of a student's study on their programme.
- 8.5) Successful recipients will be contacted and asked to indicate their preferred Bursary receipt option (as identified in Section 8.4). Where the cash bursary option is chosen for academic year 2013/14, payments will only be made following positive confirmation of attendance on each of the dates specified in Section 19. In line with UK government policy regarding tuition fee loan liability, cash bursary payments will be made in the proportions and on the dates specified in Section 19. All payments will be made directly into the student's bank account through the SLC Higher Education Bursary and Scholarships Scheme (HEBSS).
- 8.6) Where a student undertakes a compulsory year abroad or in industry as a part of their programme of study and as a result is charged tuition fees at a reduced rate, the Parklands High Bursary will be paid at a rate of 50% of the full Scholarship (i.e. £1,500) during the year abroad or in industry. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the Parklands Scholarship during that period.

## **9) The Eliahou Dangoor Scholarship**

- 9.1) The Eliahou Dangoor Scholarship will be available to approximately 30 'home' (UK) undergraduate students and to EU undergraduate students classified by the SLC as 'home', who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), and who are commencing their first year of undergraduate study in academic year 2013/14 to undertake a programme in a science, technology, engineering or mathematics (STEM) subject, and whose household income in their year of entry, as assessed by their Local Authority, SAAS, Education and Library Board or the SLC, is less than or equal to the qualifying threshold.
- 9.2) Decisions on eligibility for the Eliahou Dangoor Scholarship will be made once information on household income becomes available from the Local Authority, SAAS, Education and Library Board or SLC. Students with the lowest household income will be considered first. Students will be notified if they have received the Scholarship by the University's SAS Division.
- 9.3) For academic year 2013/14, the qualifying threshold for the Eliahou Dangoor Scholarship will be £20,817<sup>4</sup>. The University reserves the right to amend this threshold.
- 9.4) The eligible programmes for the Eliahou Dangoor Scholarship for 2013/14 entrants are specified on the University web pages at [www.liv.ac.uk/study/undergraduate/finance/dangoor-stem-subjects/](http://www.liv.ac.uk/study/undergraduate/finance/dangoor-stem-subjects/). This web page and associated tables will be maintained by the University's SRAO. A copy of the table of programmes for which the Eliahou Dangoor Scholarship is available for entrants in

academic year 2013/14, correct at the time of publishing these Regulations, is included as Appendix A.

- 9.5) The Eliahou Dangoor Scholarship will be of value £1,000. Payments for academic year 2013/14 will only be made following positive confirmation of attendance on each of the dates specified in Section 19. In line with UK government policy regarding tuition fee loan liability, payments will be made in the proportions and on the dates specified in Section 19. All payments will be made directly into the student's bank account through the SLC Higher Education Bursary and Scholarships Scheme (HEBSS).
- 9.6) The Eliahou Dangoor Scholarship will be tenable for the first year of study only.

## **10) The Postgraduate Loyalty Award**

- 10.1) Students who have completed an undergraduate programme at the University of Liverpool in one of academic years 2008/09, 2009/10, 2010/11, 2011/12 or 2012/13, who enter a full-time or part-time master's programme or research postgraduate programme in academic year 2013/14, and who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), will be considered for the Postgraduate Loyalty Award subject to the following criteria:
- i) They must be classified as a 'home' student when studying at postgraduate level.
  - ii) They must have: (a) been awarded a first or upper second class honours degree at the completion of their undergraduate programme at the University of Liverpool in one of academic years 2008/09, 2009/10, 2010/11, 2011/12 or 2012/13, or (b) for students who studied on four and five year programmes in Medicine or Dentistry, been awarded their degree with honours at the University of Liverpool in one of academic years 2009/10, 2010/11, 2011/12 or 2012/13, or (c) for students who studied on the BVSc programme, been awarded their degree with distinction or commendation at the University of Liverpool in one of academic years 2009/10, 2010/11, 2011/12 or 2012/13.
  - iii) They must have been in receipt of the Liverpool Bursary in one or more years of their undergraduate programme.
- 10.2) For full-time students the award will be of value £1,500 per annum and will be deducted from the tuition fees raised by the University. Full-time taught postgraduate students will receive the award for one year and full-time research postgraduate students will receive the award for the duration of their studies, up to a maximum of four years.
- 10.3) For part-time students the award will be paid at a rate pro-rata to the ratio of their tuition fee to the full-time tuition fee for the programme. Part-time taught postgraduates will receive the award at this pro-rata rate for a maximum of two academic years or until a sum of £1,500 has been paid, whichever occurs sooner. Part-time research students will receive the award for the duration of their studies up to a maximum of seven years or until a sum of £6,000 has been paid, whichever occurs sooner.
- 10.4) Students will not be eligible for the Postgraduate Loyalty Award in any year when they are receiving official sponsorship (e.g. payment of tuition fees by a registered company, an overseas government, the UK government or the University) of value equal to or greater than the value of the award. The value of the award will refer to the pro-rata award where the student is registered on a part-time basis.

## **11) The Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship**

- 11.1) The Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship will be available to all full-time 'overseas' undergraduate students, who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), subject to the following criteria:
- i) They must be liable to pay full tuition fees at the 'overseas' rate.
  - ii) They must be commencing a new undergraduate programme in academic year 2013/14.
  - iii) They must achieve the entry qualifications requirement specified in Section 11.2.
- 11.2) For entrants offering UK A-level or AVCE entry qualifications, the requirement for the award of a Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship shall be grades AAB from three subjects excluding General Studies. The Scholarship requirements for entrants with international (non-UK) qualifications are specified on the University web pages at [www.liv.ac.uk/study/international/aab-equiv/](http://www.liv.ac.uk/study/international/aab-equiv/). A list of these qualifications, correct at the time of publishing these Regulations, is included in Appendix B.
- 11.3) The entrance requirements for the award of a Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship for entrants in academic year 2013/14 will be those approved by the University and appearing on the web page referred to in Section 11.2 on 1 September 2013.
- 11.4) The Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship will be of value £2,500 and will be deducted from the tuition fees raised by the University.
- 11.5) A student awarded the Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship cannot concurrently hold an International Baccalaureate Award.
- 11.6) The Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship is not available to students transferring to the University from Liverpool International College or Liverpool College, for whom alternative scholarship arrangements are in place.
- 11.7) Students entering in 2013/14 and undertaking programmes specified in Appendix C to these Regulations are not eligible to receive the Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship.
- 11.8) Students will not be eligible for the Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship in any year when they are receiving official sponsorship (e.g. payment of tuition fees by a registered company, an overseas government, the UK government or the University) of value equal to or greater than the full tuition cost of the programme.
- 11.9) Prior to the start of the 2013/14 academic year, the University's SRAO will determine those applicants with confirmed (UF) places who have satisfied the requirements for the Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship and provide a definitive list to the University's SAS Division. Only the qualifications achieved to gain admission to the University will be used in the calculation of eligibility for the Award.
- 11.10) Subject to Section 11.12 below, the Scholarship will be available yearly for the normal duration of the student's study on the specified undergraduate programme provided that the student passes each year of study at their first attempt with an overall average of 70% or above. For this purpose, a student will be considered to have passed at the first attempt where the only reason for taking examinations or assessments after the normal first sitting is because of mitigating circumstances approved by the Board of Examiners of the department concerned.

- 11.11) Failure to achieve the threshold identified in Section 11.10 (above) in any year of study will result in the Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship becoming unavailable for all subsequent years of study.
- 11.12) Continuing students who are in receipt of the Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship who are undertaking a compulsory year abroad or in industry as part of their programme of study will be eligible for full tuition fee remission for the year abroad or in industry, provided that in the year prior to the year abroad or in industry they passed the year at their first attempt with an overall average of 70% or above. The provisions regarding mitigating circumstances in Section 11.10 (above) will also apply to such students. In addition, students who receive the Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship during their year abroad or in industry will automatically receive the full Scholarship in the year following the year abroad or in industry provided that they successfully progress to that year of study. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship during that period.

## **12) The International Baccalaureate Award**

- 12.1) The International Baccalaureate Award will be available to all full-time 'overseas' undergraduate students, who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), subject to the following criteria:
- i) They must be liable to pay full tuition fees at the 'overseas' rate.
  - ii) They must be commencing a new undergraduate programme in academic year 2013/14.
  - iii) They must achieve a minimum of 36 points in the full International Baccalaureate Diploma.
- 12.2) The International Baccalaureate Award will be of value £2,500 and will be deducted from the tuition fees raised by the University.
- 12.3) A student awarded the International Baccalaureate Award cannot concurrently hold a Vice Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship.
- 12.4) The International Baccalaureate Award is not available to students transferring to the University from Liverpool International College or Liverpool College, for whom alternative scholarship arrangements are in place.
- 12.5) Students entering in 2013/14 and undertaking programmes specified in Appendix C to these Regulations are not eligible to receive the International Baccalaureate Award.
- 12.6) Students will not be eligible for the International Baccalaureate Award in any year when they are receiving official sponsorship (e.g. payment of tuition fees by a registered company, an overseas government, the UK government or the University) of value equal to or greater than the full tuition cost of the programme.
- 12.7) Prior to the start of the 2013/14 academic year, the University's SRAO will determine those applicants with confirmed (UF) places who have satisfied the requirements for the International Baccalaureate Award and provide a definitive list to the University's SAS Division. Only the IB score achieved to gain admission to the University will be used in the calculation of eligibility for the Award.
- 12.8) Subject to Section 12.10 below, the Award will be available yearly for the normal duration of the student's study on the specified undergraduate programme provided that the student passes each

year of study at their first attempt with an overall average of 70% or above. For this purpose, a student will be considered to have passed at the first attempt where the only reason for taking examinations or assessments after the normal first sitting is because of mitigating circumstances approved by the Board of Examiners of the department concerned.

- 12.9) Failure to achieve the threshold identified in Section 12.8 (above) in any year of study will result in the International Baccalaureate Award becoming unavailable for all subsequent years of study.
- 12.10) Continuing students who are in receipt of the International Baccalaureate Award who are undertaking a compulsory year abroad or in industry as part of their programme of study will be eligible for full tuition fee remission for the year abroad or in industry, provided that in the year prior to the year abroad or in industry they passed the year at their first attempt with an overall average of 70% or above. The provisions regarding mitigating circumstances in Section 12.8 (above) will also apply to such students. In addition, students who receive the International Baccalaureate Award during their year abroad or in industry will automatically receive the full Award in the year following the year abroad or in industry provided that they successfully progress to this year of study. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the International Baccalaureate Award during that period.

### **13) The Liverpool Affinity Award**

- 13.1) 'Overseas' students entering full-time studies in academic year 2013/14, and who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), will be considered for the Liverpool Affinity Award subject to the following criteria:
- i) They must be classified as an 'overseas' student in academic year 2013/14.
  - ii) They must be beginning a new academic programme in academic year 2013/14.
  - iii) They must be: (a) the child<sup>5</sup>, sibling or spouse/civil partner of a current student of the University of Liverpool, or (b) the child<sup>5</sup>, sibling or spouse/civil partner of an alumnus or alumna of the University of Liverpool, or (c) returning for further study having previously studied as an international exchange student at the University of Liverpool, or (d) an alumnus or alumna of the University of Liverpool.
- 13.2) The Award will be of value £500 per annum and will be deducted from the tuition fees raised by the University. The Award will be granted on a pro-rata basis for research postgraduate students starting after 1 October 2013, and for any other student not beginning their study at the start of the academic year 2013/14. Students will receive the award for the normal duration of their study on their current programme at the University of Liverpool, subject to Section 1.3 above. Research postgraduate students will receive the award for the duration of their study on their current research programme, up to a maximum of four years.
- 13.3) Students will not be eligible for the Liverpool Affinity Award in any year when they are receiving official sponsorship (e.g. payment of tuition fees by a registered company, an overseas government, the UK government or the University) of value equal to or greater than the full tuition cost of the programme.

- 13.4) The Liverpool Affinity Award is not available to students transferring to the University from Liverpool International College or Liverpool College, for whom alternative scholarship arrangements are in place.
- 13.5) Applicants wishing to be considered for the Liverpool Affinity Award should provide evidence of their affiliation to the University of Liverpool, in accordance with Section 13.6, to [intschol@liverpool.ac.uk](mailto:intschol@liverpool.ac.uk). For undergraduate and taught postgraduate applicants, evidence satisfying the requirements in Section 13.6 must be received by 31 August 2013. Research postgraduate students may apply for the Award at any time.
- 13.6) Applicants for the Award will be required to provide evidence of their connection to the University of Liverpool in accordance with Section 13.1.iii) above. The evidence required in accordance with the criteria stated in this section is as follows:
- i) For those meeting the criteria specified in 13.1.iii)a), the full name, student ID and date of birth of their parent, sibling or spouse/civil partner, together with a copy of their birth or marriage/civil partnership certificate confirming their relationship. In the case of siblings, a copy of the sibling's birth certificate should also be provided.
  - ii) For those meeting the criteria specified in 13.1.iii)b), the full name, student ID and date of birth of their parent, sibling or spouse/civil partner, together with a copy of their award certificate and a copy of their birth or marriage/civil partnership certificate confirming their relationship. In the case of siblings, a copy of the sibling's birth certificate should also be provided.
  - iii) For those meeting the criteria specified in 13.1.iii)c), a copy of their transcript relating to their previous study at the University of Liverpool.
  - iv) For those meeting the criteria specified in 13.1.iii)d), a copy of their award certificate.
- 13.7) Prior to the start of the 2013/14 academic year, the University's SRAO will, in liaison with the University's SAS Division, determine those applicants with confirmed unconditional places who have satisfied the requirements for the Liverpool Affinity Award. Decisions relating to the award will be communicated to applicants and are not subject to appeal.
- 13.8) Where an undergraduate student undertakes a compulsory or non-compulsory year abroad or in industry as a part of their programme of study and as a result is charged tuition fees at a reduced rate, the Liverpool Affinity Award will not be paid during that period.

#### **14) The India Postgraduate Taught Award**

- 14.1) The India Postgraduate Taught Award will be available to all full-time 'overseas' postgraduate taught students, who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), subject to the following criteria:
- i) They must be liable to pay full tuition fees at the 'overseas' rate.
  - ii) They must be commencing a new postgraduate taught programme (including MRes programmes) in academic year 2013/14.
  - iii) They must be an Indian national on 1 September 2013.
- 14.2) The India Postgraduate Taught Award will be of value £1,000 and will be deducted from the tuition fees raised by the University.
- 14.3) The India Postgraduate Taught Award is not available to students transferring to the University from Liverpool International College or Liverpool College, for whom alternative scholarship arrangements are in place.

14.4) Students will not be eligible for the India Postgraduate Taught Award in any year when they are receiving official sponsorship (e.g. payment of tuition fees by a registered company, an overseas government, the UK government or the University) of value equal to or greater than the full tuition cost of the programme.

**15) The Nigeria Postgraduate Taught Award**

15.1) The Nigeria Postgraduate Taught Award will be available to all full-time 'overseas' postgraduate taught students, who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), subject to the following criteria:

- i) They must be liable to pay full tuition fees at the 'overseas' rate.
- ii) They must be commencing a new postgraduate taught programme (including MRes programmes) in academic year 2013/14.
- iii) They must be a Nigerian national on 1 September 2013.

15.2) The Nigeria Postgraduate Taught Award will be of value £1,000 and will be deducted from the tuition fees raised by the University.

15.3) The Nigeria Postgraduate Taught Award is not available to students transferring to the University from Liverpool International College or Liverpool College, for whom alternative scholarship arrangements are in place.

15.4) Students will not be eligible for the Nigeria Postgraduate Taught Award in any year when they are receiving official sponsorship (e.g. payment of tuition fees by a registered company, an overseas government, the UK government or the University) of value equal to or greater than the full tuition cost of the programme.

**16) The Liverpool International College Postgraduate Taught Award**

16.1) The Liverpool International College Postgraduate Taught Award will be available to full-time 'overseas' postgraduate taught students, who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), subject to the following criteria:

- i) They must be liable to pay full tuition fees at the 'overseas' rate.
- ii) They must be commencing a new postgraduate taught programme (including MRes programmes) in academic year 2013/14 following completion of a Liverpool International College Graduate Diploma in academic year 2012/13.
- iii) They must be: (a) an Indian national, or (b) a Nigerian national, on 1 September 2013.

16.2) The Liverpool International College Postgraduate Taught Award will be of value £1,000 and will be deducted from the tuition fees raised by the University.

16.3) Students will not be eligible for the Liverpool International College Postgraduate Taught Award in any year when they are receiving official sponsorship (e.g. payment of tuition fees by a registered company, an overseas government, the UK government or the University) of value equal to or greater than the full tuition cost of the programme.

## **17) The Liverpool International College Merit Award**

- 17.1) The Liverpool International College Merit Award will be available to full-time 'overseas' undergraduate students, who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), subject to the following criteria:
- i) They must be liable to pay full tuition fees at the 'overseas' rate.
  - ii) They must be commencing a new undergraduate programme in academic year 2013/14 following completion of a Liverpool International College Foundation Certificate in academic year 2012/13.
  - iii) They must achieve 70% or above in the Liverpool International College Foundation Certificate.
- 17.2) The Liverpool International College Merit Award will be of value £2,500 and will be deducted from the tuition fees raised by the University.
- 17.3) Students entering in 2013/14 and undertaking programmes specified in Appendix C to these Regulations are not eligible to receive the Liverpool International College Merit Award.
- 17.4) Students will not be eligible for the Liverpool International College Merit Award in any year when they are receiving official sponsorship (e.g. payment of tuition fees by a registered company, an overseas government, the UK government or the University) of value equal to or greater than the full tuition cost of the programme.
- 17.5) Prior to the start of the 2013/14 academic year, the University's SRAO will determine those applicants with confirmed (UF) places who have satisfied the requirements for the Liverpool International College Merit Award and provide a definitive list to the University's SAS Division.
- 17.6) Subject to Section 17.8 below, the Award will be available yearly for the normal duration of the student's study on the specified undergraduate programme provided that the student passes each year of study at their first attempt with an overall average of 70% or above. For this purpose, a student will be considered to have passed at the first attempt where the only reason for taking examinations or assessments after the normal first sitting is because of mitigating circumstances approved by the Board of Examiners of the department concerned.
- 17.7) Failure to achieve the threshold identified in Section 17.6 (above) in any year of study will result in the Liverpool International College Merit Award becoming unavailable for all subsequent years of study.
- 17.8) Continuing students who are in receipt of the Liverpool International College Merit Award who are undertaking a compulsory year abroad or in industry as part of their programme of study will be eligible for full tuition fee remission for the year abroad or in industry, provided that in the year prior to the year abroad or in industry they passed the year at their first attempt with an overall average of 70% or above. The provisions regarding mitigating circumstances in Section 17.6 (above) will also apply to such students. In addition, students who receive the Liverpool International College Merit Award during their year abroad or in industry will automatically receive the full Award in the year following the year abroad or in industry provided that they successfully progress to this year of study. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the Liverpool International College Merit Award during that period.

## **18) The Liverpool College Merit Award**

- 18.1) The Liverpool College Merit Award will be available to full-time 'overseas' undergraduate students, who fall within the scope of these Regulations (see Section 1), subject to the following criteria:
- i) They must be liable to pay full tuition fees at the 'overseas' rate.
  - ii) They must be commencing a new undergraduate programme in academic year 2013/14 following study at Liverpool College, Queen's Drive, Mossley Hill, Liverpool, L18 8BG.
  - iii) They must have achieved UK A-level grades AAB, excluding General Studies, or a minimum of 36 points in the full International Baccalaureate Diploma.
- 18.2) The Liverpool College Merit Award will be of value £2,500 and will be deducted from the tuition fees raised by the University.
- 18.3) Students entering in 2013/14 and undertaking programmes specified in Appendix C to these Regulations are not eligible to receive the Liverpool College Merit Award.
- 18.4) Students will not be eligible for the Liverpool College Merit Award in any year when they are receiving official sponsorship (e.g. payment of tuition fees by a registered company, an overseas government, the UK government or the University) of value equal to or greater than the full tuition cost of the programme.
- 18.5) Prior to the start of the 2013/14 academic year, the University's SRAO will determine those applicants with confirmed (UF) places who have satisfied the requirements for the Liverpool College Merit Award and provide a definitive list to the University's SAS Division. The qualifications achieved to gain admission to the University only will be used in the calculation of eligibility for the Award.
- 18.6) Subject to Section 18.8 below, the Award will be available yearly for the normal duration of the student's study on the specified undergraduate programme provided that the student passes each year of study at their first attempt with an overall average of 70% or above. For this purpose, a student will be considered to have passed at the first attempt where the only reason for taking examinations or assessments after the normal first sitting is because of mitigating circumstances approved by the Board of Examiners of the department concerned.
- 18.7) Failure to achieve the threshold identified in Section 18.6 (above) in any year of study will result in the Liverpool College Merit Award becoming unavailable for all subsequent years of study.
- 18.8) Continuing students who are in receipt of the Liverpool College Merit Award who are undertaking a compulsory year abroad or in industry as part of their programme of study will be eligible for full tuition fee remission for the year abroad or in industry, provided that in the year prior to the year abroad or in industry they passed the year at their first attempt with an overall average of 70% or above. The provisions regarding mitigating circumstances in Section 18.6 (above) will also apply to such students. In addition, students who receive the Liverpool College Merit Award during their year abroad or in industry will automatically receive the full Award in the year following the year abroad or in industry provided that they successfully progress to this year of study. Students on a non-compulsory period abroad or in industry, and whose registration is suspended during their period abroad or in industry, will not receive the Liverpool College Merit Award during that period.

## 19) Additional Information

### 19.1) Eligibility and Payments

In accordance with the relevant sections of the bursaries, awards or scholarships listed in Section 1.6, a) through to h), cash bursary payments for academic year 2013/14 will be made in three disbursements and only following positive confirmation of attendance on each of the dates specified in the table below. In line with UK government policy regarding tuition fee loan liability, payments will be made in the proportions and on the dates also specified in the table below. All payments will be made directly into the student's bank account through the SLC Higher Education Bursary and Scholarships Scheme (HEBSS).

### 19.2) Withdrawals and Suspensions of Study

Where a student withdraws from a programme of study or suspends their study in any given academic year, they will not be confirmed as in attendance on the next eligibility date (if applicable) and hence will not be entitled to the receipt of scholarships or bursaries in the proportions listed against that eligibility date and, where applicable, subsequent eligibility dates within a given academic year. Where a payment is erroneously made to a student after their withdrawal or suspension due to failures in the HEBSS or University systems, the University will require the return of such a payment. Similarly, where a scholarship or bursary is dependent on household income and, as a result of a change in income or a reassessment of the income, the student ceases to be entitled or reduces their entitlement to the scholarship or bursary, they will be required to return the applicable payments already made.

19.3) Students who withdraw from a programme of study or suspend their studies within the first four weeks of any given academic year will not be entitled to any of the bursaries, awards or scholarships prescribed in these Regulations for that academic year.

### 19.4) Fee Waivers

#### Tuition

Where the scholarships or bursaries listed in these Regulations constitute the award of a full or partial tuition fee waiver, or where a full or partial tuition fee waiver is chosen where an option is provided, the waiver will be applied in its entirety to the annual tuition fee in October of the given academic year. Where a student on an undergraduate programme of study withdraws from their programme or suspends their study, the waiver applied to the tuition fee will be adjusted in accordance with the table below.

Where a student on a postgraduate programme of study withdraws from their programme or suspends their study, the fee waiver for which they are eligible will be applied pro rata to the tuition fee calculated in accordance with the postgraduate refund policy.

### **Accommodation**

Where the scholarships or bursaries listed in these Regulations constitute the award of a full or partial accommodation fee waiver, or where a full or partial accommodation fee waiver is chosen where an option is provided, the waiver will be applied in its entirety to the annual accommodation fee in October of the given academic year. Where a student withdraws from their programme or suspends their study, the waiver applied to the accommodation fee will be adjusted in accordance with the table below.

Where a student is granted permission to leave University accommodation and terminate their residence agreement early (i.e. but not cease registration at the University), any application of accommodation fee waiver to which a student may be entitled which exceeds the accommodation fee charged shall be applied in the following order:

- i. as a cash bursary, in accordance with the payment schedule in section 19.1, and up to the maximum cash value permitted by the relevant bursary or scholarship; then,
- ii. as a tuition fee waiver.

#### **19.5) Debt to the University**

Where a student has an outstanding financial balance owing to the University 14 days prior to a due payment date of a scholarship or bursary, the relevant payment will initially be applied to the outstanding balance with any residue after settlement of the outstanding balance being paid to the student.

#### **19.6) Misrepresentation of Qualifications**

The University will require the repayment of any award based on entry qualifications where a student has wilfully misrepresented their qualifications. The student may also be reported for investigation under the University's Student Disciplinary Procedure<sup>6</sup>.

#### **19.7) Changes to Regulations**

The University retains the right to alter or add to these Regulations in the following circumstances:

- a) To adjust income thresholds to reflect inflation or other financial changes.
- b) In response to changes external to the University, for example those made by the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills, the Higher Education Funding Council for England (HEFCE), Student Finance England (SFE), the Student Awards Agency for Scotland (SAAS), Student Finance Wales (SFW), Student Finance Northern Ireland (SFNI), or the SLC.

- c) Where, at its absolute discretion, the University believes that an error or omission has been made in the Regulations.

Where changes are made to these Regulations the University will notify all appropriate students by email prior to any change coming into effect.
