

Tips for online shopping in the UK

Most major supermarkets in the UK offer a delivery service. Some of them charge a small fee for this and some of them are free if you spend a minimum amount of money. Below is a list of some local and national supermarkets in the UK, including online shops, as well as step-by-step instructions on how to make your order. You may want to make your order before you travel to make sure you can get it delivered in your first few days:

Step-by-step guide on how to order:

1. Go to your chosen supermarkets website (see above).
2. Click on 'Register' or 'Log-in' or 'Account' to register an account with them. You will need a UK address and a means of paying online for your shop.

3. Once registered, find the 'Groceries' menu on the website homepage. This may be called something else like 'Food'.
4. Use the 'Search' function to search for an item that you wish to buy (e.g. rice, apples etc). Alternatively, there may be different drop-down menus for each category of groceries (e.g. Fruit and Vegetables > Fresh Fruit > Apples).
5. Once you have found the item you want click on 'Add' or 'Add to Basket'.
6. Once you have added all your items to your basket select 'Proceed to check-out'.
7. You will then be able to select a delivery slot including date and time.
8. Finally, you will need to pay for your order.
9. Now you can sit back and wait for the groceries to be delivered straight to your door!
