

**UNIVERSITY OF LIVERPOOL INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE
IMPACT PROGRESSION SCHOLARSHIPS
REGULATIONS ACADEMIC YEAR 2022-23**

1) Scope of the Regulations

- 1.1) These Regulations apply to students first entering pathway programmes at the University of Liverpool International College during the academic year 2022-23 with a view to progressing to the University of Liverpool for an undergraduate (UG) or taught master's (PGT) programme (via progression routes approved by the University of Liverpool International College Joint Academic Board) in the academic year 2023-24.
- 1.2) Administration of these scholarships will be undertaken by Kaplan International Pathways in the first instance and Kaplan will liaise with the University of Liverpool for confirmation of the successful candidates for Progression Awards.
- 1.3) The responsible departments at the University will be the Student Recruitment, Admissions and Widening Participation (SRAWP) and Student Administration and Support (SAS) Divisions. Students progressing from pathway programmes at UoLIC to the University of Liverpool should address enquiries relating to these scholarships to liverpoolkaplan@liverpool.ac.uk.

2) Eligibility for the UoLIC Impact Progression Scholarships

- 2.1) The UoLIC Impact Progression Scholarships will be available for up to 15 x UoLIC students on successful progression to the University in 2023-24.
- 2.2) These scholarships are available to students progressing to UG or PGT programmes on a full-time basis in accordance with UK visa regulations.
- 2.3) Students should apply for the Impact Scholarships through [Kaplan](#). Candidates successful in securing a scholarship through Kaplan in all 4 categories (Sustainability; Women in STEM; Community or Career Focus) will then be considered for the Progression Scholarship at the University. Kaplan will confirm both the Impact and Impact Progression Scholarship within 4 weeks of the scholarship application deadline. The University of Liverpool will **only** be responsible for the administration of the Progression award which will be noted on the admissions/progression record for students as they progress from UoLIC to the University.
- 2.4) Where more than 15 students were awarded a Kaplan scholarship, priority for the Progression Scholarship will be given to undergraduate awardees in the categories of:
 - a. Sustainability
 - b. Women in STEM
 - c. Community

- 2.5) Students should be entering a Foundation Certificate or Pre-Masters programme at UoLIC in the 2022-23 academic year to be eligible for the Kaplan award and must meet the criteria for progression to the University in the 2023-24 academic year to be eligible for the Progression award.
- 2.6) Students must be self-funded and be liable to pay full programme fees at the 'overseas' rate.
- 2.7) The UoLIC Impact Progression Scholarship is valued at £1,500 and will be deducted from the programme fees raised by the University once students' progress from UoLIC (see section 3).
- 2.8) The Scholarship will be available for the first year of study at the University only.
- 2.9) The Scholarship can be combined with the [University of Liverpool International College Excellence Award](#).
- 2.10) Scholarships are **not** available to the following groups of students:
 - a) Students who defer progression to the University to a subsequent year of entry will be considered under the Regulations applicable in the academic year in which they begin their programme.
 - b) College students who enter programmes outside of the progression agreement (as approved by the UoLIC Joint Academic Board).
 - c) Students classified for "home fees" status.
 - d) Students will not be eligible for the UoLIC Impact Progression Scholarship in any year when they are receiving official sponsorship (e.g. payment of programme fees by a registered company, an overseas government, the UK government or the University) of value equal to or greater than the full cost of the programme.
 - e) Students in receipt of staff fee remission.
- 2.11) The University's decision on eligibility shall be final.

3) Administration of the Award

- 3.1) The Student Recruitment and Admissions Division at the University will be responsible for providing a list of successful scholarship awardees to the Student Administration and Support Division to ensure the scholarship is deducted from programme fees as outlined below.
- 3.2) The scholarship will be deducted from the annual programme fee in October of the given academic year. Where a student on an undergraduate programme of study withdraws from their programme or suspends their study, the deduction from the programme fee will be adjusted in accordance with the schedule as below. The dates in the table are indicative for the 2022-23 academic year and the dates for the 2023-24 academic year will be published in due course.

From	To	Proportion of Programme Fee Waiver Applied
26 September 2022	23 October 2022	0%
24 October 2022	8 January 2023	25%
9 January 2023	2 April 2023	50%
3 April 2023	2 June 2023	100%

Where a student on a postgraduate programme of study withdraws from their programme or suspends their study, the fee deduction for which they are eligible will be applied pro rata to the programme fee calculated in accordance with the postgraduate refund policy.

4) **Misrepresentation**

The University will require the repayment of any award where a student has wilfully misrepresented their eligibility. The student may also be reported for investigation under the University's Policy on Student Conduct and Discipline¹.

5) **Changes to Regulations**

The University reserves the right to alter or add to these Regulations where, at its absolute discretion, the University believes that an error or omission has been made in the Regulations.

Where changes are made to these Regulations the University will notify all appropriate students by email prior to any change coming into effect.
