



Abercromby Square | D

Built between 1820 and 1865, and named after General Sir Ralph Abercromby commander in chief of the British Army in Egypt, who was killed in the battle of Alexandria in 1801, the square was originally occupied by Liverpool's shipping merchants. The University acquired the square in the 1920's and it is now home to the Institute of Irish Studies, Philosophy Civic Design, History and Archaeology, Classics and Egyptology.



Victoria Gallery & Museum

The Victoria Building, the first purpose built building of the University, originally opened in 1889. Designed by the Liverpool-born architect Alfred Waterhouse (who also designed the Natural History Museum in ource of the term 'redbrick university'. The uilding now houses a museum, containing works by JMV Turner, Lucien Freud and John James Audobon.


