**Travelling by car?**  
From the end of the M62 continue straight ahead onto Edge Lane (A5080 then A5047) and follow signs for Liverpool City Centre and the University. Use postcode L3 5TR for directions.



**Travelling by public transport?**  
The University campus is a short walk from Liverpool Lime Street station and the National Express coach station is located centrally at Liverpool ONE.



**Parking on campus**  
As parking is severely restricted on campus, we advise visitors use public transport wherever possible. The nearest public car park is on Mount Pleasant, L3 5TB.

**Abercromby Square | D**  
Built between 1820 and 1865, and named after General Sir Ralph Abercromby, commander in chief of the British Army in Egypt, who was killed in the battle of Alexandria in 1801, the square was originally occupied by Liverpool's shipping merchants. The University acquired the square in the 1920's and it is now home to the Institute of Irish Studies, Philosophy, Civic Design, History and Archaeology, Classics and Egyptology.



**Victoria Gallery & Museum 421 | L**  
The Victoria Building, the first purpose built building of the University, originally opened in 1889. Designed by the Liverpool-born architect Alfred Waterhouse (who also designed the Natural History Museum in London) its distinctive redbrick design is the source of the term 'redbrick university'. The building now houses a museum, containing works by JMV Turner, Lucien Freud and John James Audobon.



**Vine Court 804, 805 | E**  
Vine Court offers a mix of both catered and self-catering accommodation for around 750 students. Study bedrooms are all ensuite with a high speed broadband connection with shared social kitchen/ diners and lounge areas. Vine Court has an excellent restaurant, laundrette and large student chill-out mezzanine and outdoor spaces for socialising.



**Student Support and Careers & Employability 750 | A**  
Our Student Services Centre is the hub for all our specialist welfare and health and wellbeing services, offering advice, support and info on a wide range of non-academic issues including finance, disability and general welfare. This building also houses our award winning Careers & Employability Services. Our students and alumni can access a range of resources and services including access to a wide range of job opportunities, support in finding work placements and internships in the UK and overseas and support from our team of professional advisers.



**Liverpool Guild of Students 501 | B**  
The students' union, Liverpool Guild of Students recently underwent a £13.8 million refurbishment and is at the heart of campus life, offering spaces for over 250 societies, socialising, music, volunteering and much more. **Sports Centre 511 | C**  
Our fully equipped sports centre offers a wide range of facilities including a 25m swimming pool, fitness suite, two sports halls and dance and spinning studios at the heart of campus. Memberships are available at extremely competitive rates.

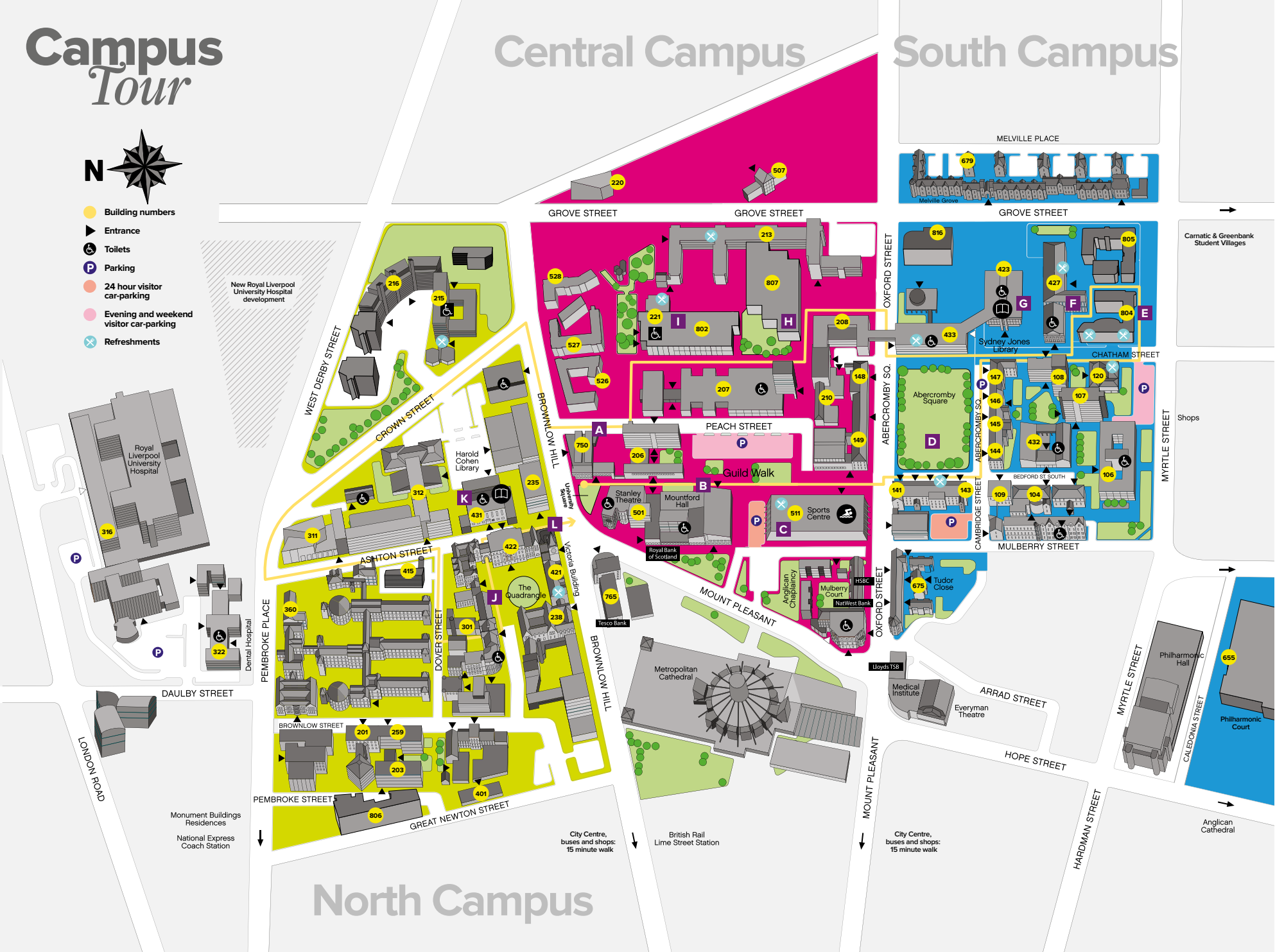


**Harold Cohen Library 431 | K**  
Following a £2.6 million refurbishment, the Harold Cohen Library features a revamped reception area, an additional 220 study spaces, more power sockets, increased social seating space, as well as a postgraduate study room and eight bookable group study rooms. Housing the main collections in Dentistry, Engineering, Science, Medicine, Veterinary Science and Mathematics, the Harold Cohen Library is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

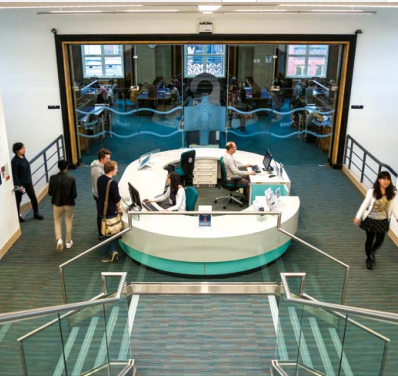
**Management School 427 | F**  
Our Management School is in the top 5% of business schools worldwide. The School's new extension is providing a world-class teaching environment, including the state-of-the-art Bloomberg Suite, for undergraduates, postgraduates and management professionals at all stages of their careers and alumni.



**Central Teaching Laboratories (CTL) 802 | I**  
The CTL has transformed the way in which Physical and Environmental Sciences are taught at the University. The building contains high-tech teaching facilities including laboratories and social study spaces.

**Sydney Jones Library 423 | G**  
The Sydney Jones Library is the main library for the Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Environmental studies and Law and Social Justice. Following a £20 million expansion and refurbishment project, the Sydney Jones Library offers seating for 600 readers, 420 computers, wireless internet access, bookable group study rooms and a cafe.



**Materials Innovation Factory 807 | H**  
The Materials Innovation Factory (MIF) is a £68 million partnership between the University of Liverpool, Unilever and HEFCE. Providing an unparalleled suite of open access, state-of-the-art equipment and world-leading academic expertise, the MIF is a unique materials chemistry research hub. The cutting-edge equipment here is helping us to discover new materials which have the potential to save energy and natural resources, improve health and transform a variety of manufacturing processes.



**Engineering 238 | J**  
Originally established in 1885 the University has invested a total of £36 million on the School of Engineering's flagship Harrison Hughes building. As part of this investment, the Active Learning Laboratory produces 'industry ready' engineers. The cubic glass structure spectacularly lights up at night.
