



Asylum Seekers Bursary 2020 ***A sanctuary award***

The University of Liverpool is pleased to offer tuition fee and maintenance support for up to four undergraduate students who have sought protection in the UK, so they can succeed in higher education. The scholarships cover the cost of tuition and provide awards from £3,000* per year to support the costs of study e.g. equipment, books, travel and accommodation.

These awards are for applicants applying for undergraduate programmes only, excluding clinical programmes in the Schools of Medicine, Dentistry, Health Sciences and Veterinary Science.

**The value of the bursary awarded will be dependent upon individual circumstances.*

Eligibility

To be considered for our Asylum Seekers Bursary you must:

- be an asylum seeker in the UK, a dependant of someone seeking asylum, or have temporary status such as discretionary leave or limited leave to remain in the UK, or be the dependent of someone with such status
- have been granted Humanitarian Protection, leave as a stateless person, or Limited Leave to Remain in the UK, or be a dependant or partner of someone with leave on these grounds.
- have applied for asylum in the UK before you applied for a place at University
- be unable to access mainstream funding, e.g. funding from the Student Loans Company or local authority grants

hold a conditional or unconditional offer from the University of Liverpool for a full time undergraduate course starting in September 2020 (excluding clinical programmes in the Schools of Medicine, Dentistry, Health Sciences and Veterinary Science)

- not already hold a degree or equivalent higher level qualification
- currently attend a school, college, community or voluntary group who will provide a reference in support of your application. Priority may be given to applicants who have been educated in the local area (Merseyside)
- submit a complete application form with all relevant documentation by the deadline – **30th April 2020.**

Required documentation

- **Visa Status Documentation:** please submit a copy of your visa status documents
- **Proof of current residency:** e.g. bank statement, utility bill, tenancy agreement
- **Proof of date of entry to the United Kingdom:** e.g. passport stamp, letter from UKVI

These documents may need to be obtained from your immigration solicitor.

Part 6: Your statement

- What are your personal and family circumstances and what barriers have you overcome in order to continue with your education – with specific reference to your current status in the UK? **You do not need to give details of the events that led to your seeking asylum.**
- What are your financial circumstances – how have you managed financially whilst at school/college and how will you support yourself at university? The funding available is adjusted according to individual needs, so please explain your plans for how you will manage financially at university.
- What additional support will you need to succeed at university?

Part 7: Your reference

Please provide a supporting statement from a referee to complete your application. The referee must provide their contact details and confirm that the school, college, community or voluntary group they represent wishes to support your application. The supporting statement should be no longer than 750 words and should answer the following questions:

- What are the applicants personal and financial circumstances and what barriers have they overcome to continue their education.
- How well suited is the applicant to the university course they plan to undertake and how realistic are their ambitions?
- What contribution, to your knowledge, has the student made to college life and/or their community?
- How do you think the student would benefit from the support offered by the University of Liverpool?
- Is there any other information that you believe is relevant to the student's application?
