Welcome to Open Day!



TOP TIPS

University Square is at the heart of campus (a map of campus can be found on page 32), and is your hub on Open Day. Here you can pick up a guide and a tote bag, get directions and chat to our helpful staff. You can also find our Welfare Stand, which will have additional water, seats, lost property and our lost persons meeting point.

There is a sensory room in the Sydney Jones library equipped with sensory objects, dimmable lights, comfortable seating, and other amenities.

Our Muslim prayer room is located on the lower ground floor of the Sydney Jones Library.



All of our Open Day buildings have accessible toilets. Changing Places toilets can also be found in the Yoko Ono Lennon Centre and Chadwick Building.



Food and drink

We have plenty of places across campus to stop for refreshments, ranging from hot snacks and sandwiches to bar meals and pizza. You'll also find Independent food vendors across our campus offering choices such as cakes, crepes and street food.

Speak to representatives from **Go Higher** and **Carmel College**. If you are a **mature student**, and have the potential to study at degree level but lack formal qualifications, **Go Higher** can open the door to the Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences.

The foundation year at **Carmel College** offers direct progression onto a number of our degree courses including Health, Veterinary, Medicine, Dentistry (for **mature** individuals who may already be working in a related career or have a degree in a subject which is not science based) and Science and Engineering (for applicants **aged 18+** who do not meet the standard entry requirements for a degree).

Libraries

Widening Participation & Outreach


