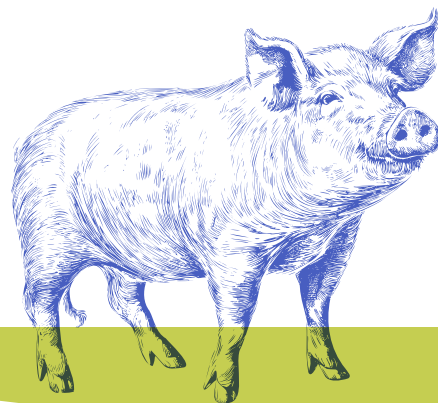

Campus Map



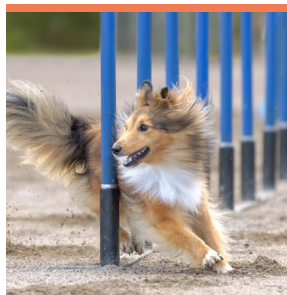
