Get ready for the 2026 breeding season with our brand-new, practical workshop focused on managing subfertility in mares and stallions. Designed specifically for equine vets in ambulatory practice, this course will boost your confidence and clinical decision-making through an evidence-based approach.

Morning lectures will provide delegates with a practical evidence-based approach to managing the mare for insemination and approach to the subfebrile mare. Surgical reproductive procedures will then be discussed concluding with a lecture on advanced assisted reproductive techniques.

The afternoon will be spent in the lab where delegates will carry out semen analysis and processing. Delegates will also be able to perform techniques used in mare breeding soundness examinations, on specimens. The afternoon will conclude with an informal case-based discussion, covering a wide range of topics.

Learning outcomes

- Develop an evidence-based approach to breeding the mare and managing common subfertility issues of the mare
- · Develop understanding of surgical reproductive procedures and when they are indicated
- Develop understanding of the advanced assisted reproductive techniques currently available in equine reproduction

- Develop practical skills in semen analysis and processing
- Develop practical skills in performing and interpreting mare endometrial culture, cytology and biopsy

In February 2026, we will be offering a Physiotherapy Masterclass on the Equine Back and Pelvis, aimed at both qualified Physiotherapists* and Equine Clinicians looking to refresh their knowledge of the assessment and treatment options available in this common area of practice. The weeks will focus on revising back and pelvis pathology before reviewing current approaches to diagnosis, assessment and initial management from both professional perspectives. EQUINE VETERINARY NURSING

3RD NOVEMBER 2025

Our new Nursing Online CPD mini-modules have been developed for and aimed towards veterinary nurses. These 100% online modules will run over three weeks and will include one Zoom meeting. A different topic will be covered each week, providing you with 15 hours of CPD. The course is taught by experienced equine Veterinary Nurses from the University of Liverpool referral hospital teams, and other veterinary contributors. Teaching materials are in the form of online lectures, readings, interactive discussion boards, live Zoom sessions with course tutors and speakers and weekly MCQ tests designed to help support your learning. You also have access to the university of Liverpool online library and to discussions with tutors and peers, making learning fun and interactive.

- The pharmacodynamics of common equine drug categories (antimicrobials and analgesia)
- Understanding Osmosis and the fundamentals of fluid therapy
- Setting up and maintaining a general practice lab

- Suture and needle types, suture patterns, and their applications in equine surgery
- The role and responsibilities of the scrub and circulatory nurse
- · General anaesthesia monitoring
- · Preparing for a safer anaesthetic recovery
