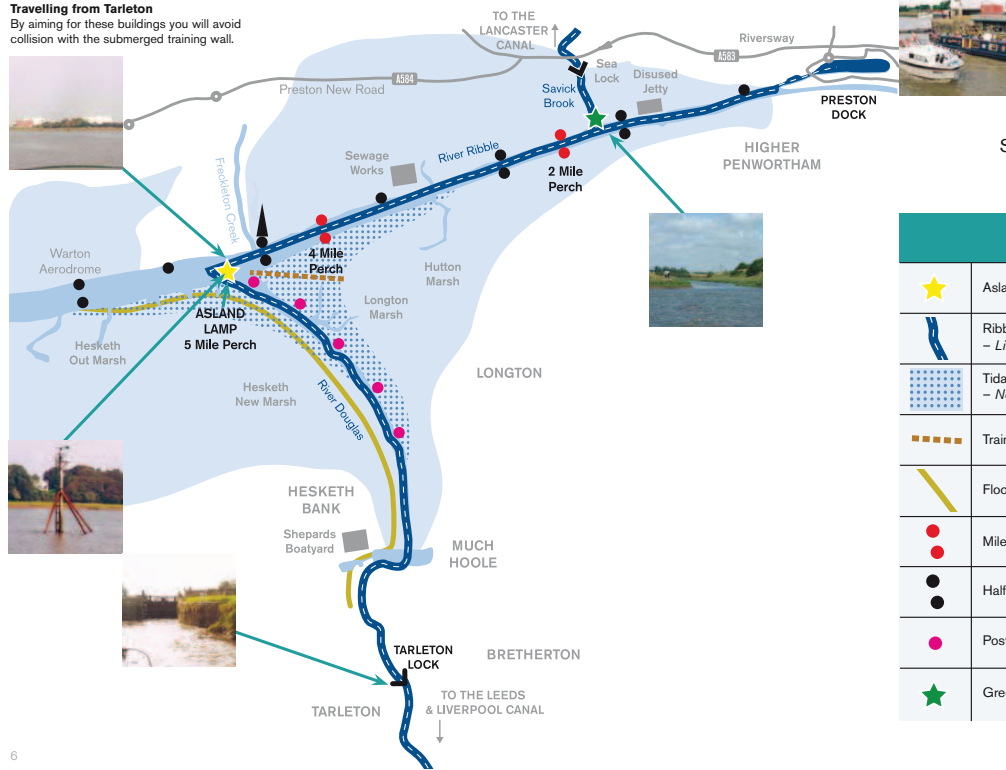


NAVIGATING THE RIVER DOUGLAS AND RIVER RIBBLE



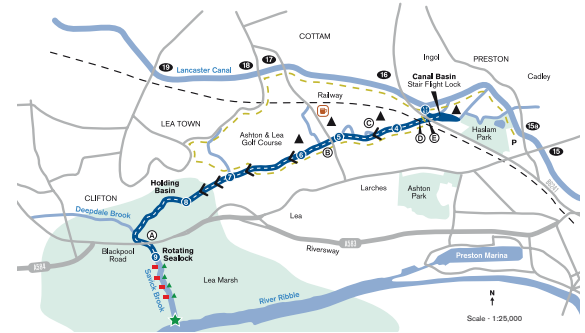
Travelling from Tarleton

***Please note**
We recommend you arrive at departure point 4 hours before high tide when travelling from Savick to Tarleton (down the link). Travelling time will need to include passage through the Ribble Link into the Ribble Estuary and the River Douglas. Therefore it is important that you take this additional time into account.

NAVIGATING THE MILLENNIUM RIBBLE LINK

The limited opening times of the Millennium Ribble Link are dictated by the tidal nature of the Ribble Estuary. The Link itself incorporates a staircase lock and a sea lock, both of which are manned for safety reasons, in addition to 5 individual locks.

The Millennium Ribble Link will provide an exciting challenge for all keen boaters.
